Why go for an MBA?

As opportunities grow and markets expand, the need for qualified and capable people in the management cadre is now stronger than ever. - For students who are passionate about a specific line of work, such as Advertising, Strategy, Finance, HR, etc., an MBA helps them explore their interests while making sure they don't lose out on a good income.

Management exams: What do they test?

Management entrance tests are designed to evaluate your worth as a potential manager and they consist of various sections to analyse your skill levels. The selection process at most institutes consists of two stages:

- 1) Written Examination
- 2) Group Discussion, Essay Writing (only for select B-Schools) and Interview (GDPI).

The written tests are usually of 2 to 3 hours duration with multiple choice questions and negative marking for incorrect answers. The test contains sections aimed at assessing your aptitude in various subjects, such as:

- **Verbal Ability:** Tests your vocabulary, usage of words, grammar and verbal reasoning skills.
- **Reading Comprehension:** Evaluates your ability to comprehend and assimilate formal written English.
- **Quantitative Ability:** Tests your fundamental understanding of Mathematics (up-to Std. X level).
- **Data Interpretation:** Tests your ability to identify, understand and interpret relevant information from various forms of data like graphs and charts.
- **Data Sufficiency:** Tests your ability to examine the available data and determine whether it's sufficient to answer the questions posed, based on your understanding of mathematics.
- **Analytical and Critical Reasoning:** Assesses your ability to process data and arrive at logical conclusions.
- **General Knowledge / Business Awareness:** Although questions on GK / Business Awareness have not been included in the CAT since its inception, most other management entrance tests like XAT, SNAP, IIFT, TISS, CMAT and MAT contain them. Some B-Schools like XLRI, SP Jain and TAPMI may also ask you to write an essay.

Most B-Schools shortlist applicants after the written test. Selected candidates will then face the Group Discussion and Personal Interview rounds. Some B-Schools also use other tools like Essay Writing, Group Tasks, Case Studies, Extempore and Group Interviews to assess knowledge, communication and managerial skills, and to check confidence levels and attitudes of the applicants.



How do you get into India's top B-Schools?

Admissions into over **150** management institutes, including the IIMs, is based on the Common Admission Test (CAT) conducted by the IIMs. This makes the CAT the holy grail for every MBA aspirant. A B-School may use the scores of more than one entrance test to shortlist candidates. Some of the major entrance tests are:

- **Common Admission Test (CAT):** This is conducted by the IIMs. Prominent B-Schools that accept the CAT score include the 19 IIMs, FMS - Delhi, MDI - Gurgaon, SP Jain - Mumbai, National Institute of Industrial Engineering (NITIE) - Mumbai, Schools of Management (SoMs) at IIT - Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kharagpur, Kanpur and Roorkee, Mudra Institute of Communications (MICA), IMT - Ghaziabad, etc.
- **Xavier Aptitude Test (XAT):** Conducted by XLRI. The XAT score is accepted by XLRI - Jamshedpur, Xavier Institute of Management (XIMB) - Bhubaneswar, Goa Institute of Management (GIM), SP Jain, etc.
- **Symbiosis National Aptitude Test (SNAP):** Conducted and accepted by the Symbiosis Group of Institutes including Symbiosis Institute of Business Management (SIBM), Symbiosis Centre of Management & Human Resources Development (SCMHRD), Symbiosis Institute of International Business (SIIB), Symbiosis Institute of Telecom Management (SITM), Symbiosis Institute of Management Studies (SIMS), etc.
- **Narsee Monjee Aptitude Test (NMAT):** Conducted by Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies (NMIMS) for its MBA programs.
- **Common Management Admission Test (CMAT):** Conducted by All-India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), twice a year in September and February.
- **Management Aptitude Test (MAT):** Conducted by All-India Management Association (AIMA). A large number of B-Schools across the country accept this test score.
- Some B-Schools conduct their own tests, viz. IIFT Entrance Test for Indian Institute of Foreign Trade - New Delhi & Kolkata, TISSNET for Tata Institute of Social Sciences, MICA of Mudra Institute of Communications and IBSAT for ICFAI Group of Business Schools, etc.

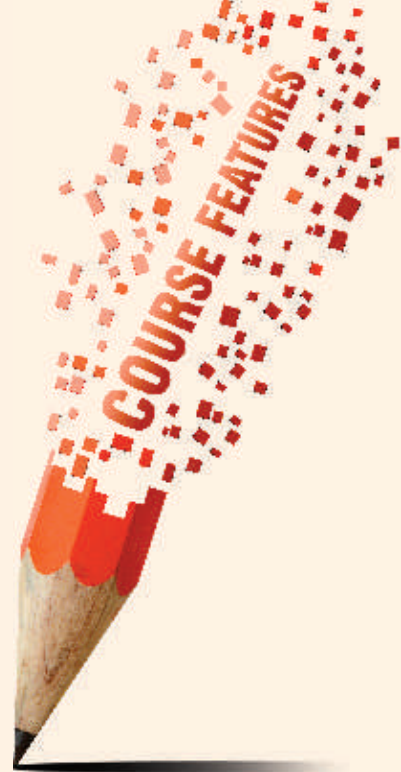

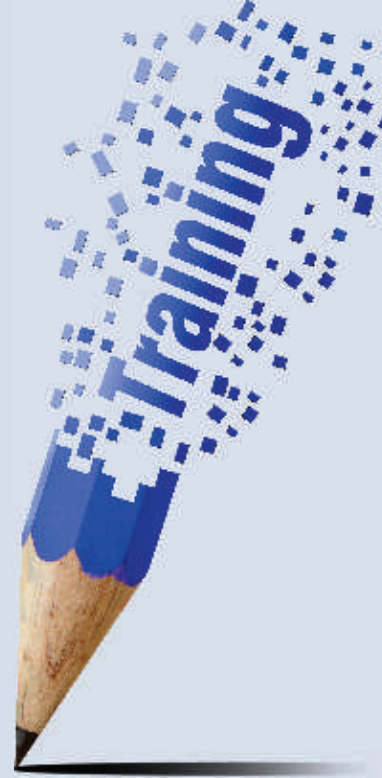

Facing the CAT: FAQs

Q. What criteria should you seek to find a trusted and effective CAT training institute?

A. We encourage you to dig deep into the claims of the organisations that you are considering. The papers are full of tall, often misleading claims and inflated admission numbers achieved. We advise students to ask questions, find out the details and get to really know an institution's reputation.

Q. You say that 2116 students have got 7379 IIM selections in CAT 2014. What does this mean?

A. A large number of students get final selections into more than one IIM. If you count the number of final selections secured by **T.I.M.E.** students in the **16** IIMs in 2014, it adds up to **7379**. However, this number was achieved by **2116** students! Do not get confused between 'calls' and 'selections'. 'Calls' is a term used to indicate short-lists for the GD / PI round. What really matters is the 'final selection' into the IIMs.

Q. What is the selection process of the IIMs?

A. The IIMs follow a two stage selection process – the written exam (CAT) and the GWPI (Group Discussion / Written Ability Test / Personal Interview). A shortlist of candidates is done after the first stage, taking into account their written exam score, academic background and work experience. The standard government norms of reservation shall be applicable. The institutes would also have a minimum criteria for candidature. However, with a sincere effort, this is not difficult to clear.

Shortlisted applicants are required to appear for the second round where they are subjected to a Personal Interview, Written Ability Test and Group Discussion. Most IIMs have now shifted to Written Ability Test (WAT) from Group Discussion (GD) as part of the selection process. The final list of selected candidates is prepared taking into account the performance in the written exam, the GWPI stage, academic background, work experience, etc.

Q. What is the pattern of CAT?

A. CAT had three sections (as per CAT 2015) - Verbal Ability, Reading Comprehension (Section 1), Logical Reasoning, Data Interpretation (Section 2), Quantitative Ability (Section 2). Candidates have 60 minutes to attempt each of the three sections. The first and the last sections have 34 questions each while the second section has 32 questions. In case of multiple choice questions, the candidates are awarded 3 marks for a right answer, penalized 1 mark for a wrong attempt. In case of non-multiple questions, the candidates are awarded 3 marks for a right answer and are penalized by 1 mark for a wrong answer.

Q. What kind of salary can I expect if I graduate from a top B-School?

A. Salaries on campus depends on the academic performance (during MBA) and the candidate's profile. The average salary figures of top-rung schools like IIM-A/XLRI/FMS/IIM-C/SP Jain, etc. can be over Rs. 16 lakhs per annum. The maximum salaries (for Indian jobs) at these places frequently cross Rs. 30 lakhs per annum, and institutes like the IIM-A top the list with close to Rs. 40 lakhs per annum. However, one needs to also look at the minimum salaries to understand the complete picture – being around Rs. 6-7 lakhs per annum. The most important thing to remember is that, an MBA from a decent B-School would invariably spike your earning potential. All you need to do is gain admission into the right B-School.

Q. What is the weightage given to the factors still within your control i.e. CAT, GD, WAT & PI ?

A. Most IIMs have at least 80% of the above controllables. Academics are not as critical. Not possessing work experience is certainly not a cause for worry.

Q. Is it really better to first get a few years of work experience and then prepare for CAT?

A. Sample a scenario: Ram is an engineering student in the final year of college who has been placed with a leading IT firm in the country. He is really confused if he should attempt the CAT now or get two years of experience first and then attempt it. Now consider the following:

- Assuming the fee of the college he would get into two years later does not go up, he is effectively choosing between making Rs. 8.4 lakhs in 2 years and then doing an MBA or doing an MBA first, making Rs. 25.2 lakhs in two years. Clearly he would have earned Rs. 16.8 lakhs more if he first went for an MBA.

- The fee for the B-School has been assumed to remain the same. In practice it is likely to go up with every passing year.
- For a job promotion, his work experience as an MBA would be more relevant and valuable.
- If he wrote the CAT as a fresher and things did not go his way, he can always attempt it a second time.

- With a job, it would be difficult for him to start his preparation for an entrance test, as his job wouldn't leave him with much time. If he has prepared earlier, he can definitely find time to brush up his concepts but not otherwise.
- If we look at the weightage given to work experience in the IIMs, it's not more than 10% for most of the IIMs. So, it's not as much of an edge as it is made out to be.
- Even during the placements at a B-School, the added incentive for every year of work-experience is not much in monetary terms.

Q. Is it necessary to choose MBA Specialisation(s) at the time of application itself?

A. No, in most cases, it is not required. As per the syllabi, most management institutes offer General Management courses. In this kind of a course a student learns the basics of all functional areas, viz. Marketing, Finance, Human Resources, Systems and Operations. During the first year and second year (or say final year) there is an option of choosing subjects depending on one's area of interest. It should be noted that in most cases, the student need not decide on the functional area he / she is interested in at the time of seeking admission.

Q. What is the difference between PGPM and MBA (also called PGDM#)?

A. When an institute is an autonomous body (meaning it is not affiliated to any university) and conducts management courses then such Institutes cannot offer an MBA degree. Instead, they award a Post-Graduate Diploma in Management (PGDM) or a Post-Graduate Diploma in Business Administration (PGDBA). Only universities (foreign or Indian) can grant MBA degrees. The IIMs, XLRI, etc. offer only a diploma.

However, students are advised to bear in mind that the value of the management course pursued by them does not depend on whether it is a 'Degree' or a 'Diploma', rather it depends on the reputation and standing of the institute that is offering the Degree or Diploma. When companies recruit management graduates, they certainly don't worry about the title of the course offered at the particular institute. They look at the intrinsic worth and the reputation of the institute, quality of the course offered and of course, the calibre of the students.

#The Programme is called PGPM (Post Graduate Programme in Management) and the degree offered is PGDM (Post Graduate Diploma in Management)

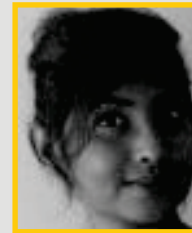
