# Britain becomes the first European nation to join the CPTPP.

Britain became the first European nation to join the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), becoming the 12th member of the bloc. Established in 2018, the bloc safeguards against Chinese hegemony in the region, providing British companies access to a market of over 500 million people, contributing over 15% of the world's GDP. The bloc comprises Canada and Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Brunei, Chile, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Singapore, and Vietnam.

# Mikheil Kavelashvili elected the next President of Georgia.

Mikheil Kavelashvili has been elected the next President of Georgia, amid growing resentment over the government's postponement of the European Union accession process until 2028. Mikheil Kavelashvili is a former footballer and MP from the ruling Georgian Dream party. Kavelashvili, the only candidate for the job, was chosen in Parliament by a direct ballot of a 300-member electoral college made up of MPs and representatives of local government. 224 out of 225 members of Georgia's electoral college voted for him. The election process took place according to the constitutional changes that ended the direct election of the President and took effect this year.

# <u>Impeachment of President Yoon Suk Yeol of South Korea.</u>

In South Korea, the Parliament today voted to impeach President Yoon Suk Yeol over his short-lived martial law declaration earlier this month. Yoon would become the second President in South Korea's history to be removed from office through impeachment, after former President Park Geun-hye in 2017. After this impeachment by the Parliament, President Yoon's powers will be suspended until the Constitutional Court decides whether to reinstate or remove him from office.

# Martyred Intellectuals Day observed in Bangladesh

Bangladesh observed the Martyred Intellectuals Day to mark the day of horror when Pakistani forces killed hundreds of intellectuals including teachers, doctors, journalists, and others in Dhaka and other parts of Bangladesh in 1971. On 14 December 1971, just two days before Bangladesh got liberation, the Pakistani occupation forces with the help of their local collaborators named Razakar, Al-Badr and Al-Shams, went on a torture and killing spree of the most prominent intellectuals of the country.

### Indian capital markets witness heavy inflows

Foreign investors poured in nearly 28,000 crore rupees into the Indian capital markets in the first two weeks of December. As per the depositories data, the foreign portfolio investors, or FPIs, brought in 22,766 crore rupees into the Indian equities markets and 4,814 crore rupees into the debt market. This follows heavy outflows in the last few months. So far this year, FPIs have invested 1.2 lakh crore rupees into the Indian capital markets.

### <u>Public Sector Banks (PSBs) in India record</u> their highest-ever aggregate net profit

Public Sector Banks (PSBs) in India have recorded their highest-ever aggregate net profit of around 1 lakh 41 thousand crore in the financial year 2023-24. The Gross Non-Performing Assets (GNPA) ratio has declined, dropping to 3.12 percent in September this year. This is a steep decline from the peak GNPA of 14.58 percent in March 2018. The Finance Ministry revealed that the PSBs have also contributed significantly to shareholder returns, paying a total dividend of almost 62 thousand crore rupees over the past three years. The ministry hailed this remarkable financial growth of the sector's operational efficiency. improved asset quality, and stronger capital base.
