## <u>US administration lifts sanctions on Syria</u>

The US administration has taken significant steps to lift sanctions on Syria, following President Donald Trump's earlier pledge to assist the war-torn country in its recovery efforts.

The U.S. Treasury Department issued a general license that clears the way for transactions involving Syria's interim government, led by President Ahmed al-Sharaa, as well as its central bank and state-owned enterprises.

European Union diplomats have also agreed to lift economic sanctions on Syria, a move aimed at supporting the country's reconstruction after the ousting of President Bashar al-Assad.

### <u>Trump Signs Executive Orders to</u> Reform U.S. Nuclear Industry

US President Donald Trump has signed executive orders for a reform of the country's nuclear industry. The administration says it will reduce regulatory barriers and speed construction of nuclear reactors.

The reforms will make it easier for the authorities to approve new nuclear power plant construction.

Approvals have usually taken more than 10 years, but Washington has set an 18-month deadline for the final decision.

The action aims to prepare for a surge in electricity demand due to growing use of AI and other technologies, including quantum computers.

### <u>U.S. to Impose Sanctions on Sudan Over</u> <u>Chemical Weapons Use in Civil War</u>

The United States is set to impose new sanctions on Sudan following a formal determination that the country used chemical weapons during its ongoing civil war in 2024.

These measures include restrictions on U.S. exports to Sudan and limitations on access to government-backed credit.

## Centre approves 8.25% interest rate on EPF deposits for FY 2024-25

The Centre has approved 8.25 percent interest rate on Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) deposits for the financial year 2024-25.

This will benefit over 7 crore salaried employees across India. This rate was recommended earlier this year by the Central Board of Trustees of the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO).

The approved rate remains unchanged from 2023-24 fiscal, while it was 8.15 percent in 2022-23.

### NTPC Q4 Profit Jumps 22% to ₹7,897 Crore

State-run power major NTPC reported a 22% year-on-year rise in its consolidated net profit, reaching ₹7,897.14 crore in the fourth quarter of FY25. The profit growth was driven by increased revenue from its power generation segment.

In the same quarter of the previous fiscal (Q4 FY24), NTPC had posted a net profit of ₹6,490.05 crore, the company stated in a regulatory filing.

NTPC's total income rose to ₹51,085.05 crore in the March 2025 quarter, compared to ₹48,816.55 crore in Q4 of FY24. Revenue from the core generation business

alone climbed to ₹49,352.99 crore, up from ₹47,088.70 crore in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

## Tennis: Djokovic becomes third to win 100 ATP Singles titles

Serbian Tennis superstar Novak Djokovic has scripted another history by becoming the third man to reach 100 career ATP Tour titles.

Djokovic defeated Hubert Hurkacz 5-7, 7-6, 7-6 in the Geneva Open final in Switzerland to reach this milestone.

With his victory, Djokovic joined Jimmy Connors and Roger Federer as the only men in the Open Era to win 100 or more titles.

# ISSF Junior World Cup: Shambhavi clinches Gold in women's 10 mt air rifle event

In Shooting, India's Shambhavi Shravan Kshirsagar clinched gold medal in the women's 10 meter air rifle event at the ISSF Junior World Cup 2025 in Suhl, Germany. Ojasvi Thakur bagged silver medal in the same event.

With this, India has jumped to the top of the points table with a total of 8 medals including 2 gold, 3 silver and 3 bronze medals.

Shubman Gill has been named as Test captain for Team India, while Rishabh Pant has been chosen as vice-captain in Test cricket.
