## UNGA Elected Five Countries as Non-Permanent Members of the UN Security Council

The United Nations General Assembly elected five countries—Bahrain, Colombia, Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Latvia, and Liberia—as non-permanent members of the UN Security Council for the 2026-2027 term.

These nations will assume their roles on January 1, 2026, succeeding Algeria, Guyana, Sierra Leone, Slovenia, and South Korea.

#### US Withdraws About 500 Troops From Syria

The United States has withdrawn about 500 troops from Syria, following the fall of the Assad regime and a shift in its Middle East policy. The US has vacated three bases in Syria.

In April, the Pentagon announced its plans to decrease its military troops in Syria from two thousand to under one thousand as part of efforts to consolidate US forces.

## India to Build First-Ever Indigenous Polar Research Vessel with Norwegian Firm

India's Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Limited (GRSE) and Norway's Kongsberg Oslo signed an MoU that paves the way for India to build its first-ever Polar Research Vessel (PRV) indigenously.

The vessel will be equipped with the latest scientific equipment and will enable researchers to explore the oceans' depths, study marine ecosystems, and unlock new insights into our planet's past, present, and future.

# CAQM Issues Directions to Control Biomass Burning

The Commission for Air Quality Management has issued statutory directions to control air pollution from biomass burning and incidents of fire at sanitary landfill and dump sites in Delhi-NCR.

CAQM has asked the Urban Local Bodies and other concerned agencies in NCR to identify, categorize, demarcate and assess the fire risk of all sanitary landfills and dump sites in the region.

CAQM further instructed the Haryana and Punjab governments to mandate the use of paddy straw-based biomass pellets in all brick kilns located in the districts beyond NCR, as one of the means towards elimination of the practice of open paddy stubble burning.

# **Presiding Officers to Enter Voter Turnout** on ECINET App

The Election Commission will introduce a technology-driven system to provide timely updates on the approximate voter turnout percentage trends.

ECI said that this new process will significantly reduce the time lag associated with the manual reporting methods.

The Presiding Officer of each polling station will now be directly entering voter turnout on the new ECINET App every two hours on polling days in order to reduce the time lag in the updation of the approximate polling trends.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the Chenab Bridge in Jammu and Kashmir on 6<sup>th</sup> June.

### **Ladakh Gets New Policies on Quota**

The Indian government has introduced a significant policy change for the Union Territory of Ladakh, aimed at preserving the region's unique cultural and demographic identity.

A substantial 85% of government jobs in Ladakh are now reserved for local residents.

To qualify as a domicile of Ladakh, individuals must have resided in Ladakh for at least 15 years, or studied in Ladakh for a minimum of 7 years and appeared in Class 10 or 12 examinations within the region.
