### Government of Pakistan Decides to Hand Over Security of Islamabad to Pakistan Army

In Pakistan, the Government of Pakistan has decided to hand over the security of the capital, Islamabad, to the Pakistan Army amid the fast-changing security situation with violent protests, clashes, arrests, cellular services, and internet blockades.

The SCO (Shanghai Cooperation Organisation) Summit is scheduled to be held in Islamabad on the 15th and 16th of October.

### <u>DRDO Successfully Tests 4th Generation</u> VSHORADS

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully conducted three flight tests of the 4th Generation Very Short Range Air Defence System (VSHORADS) at the Pokhran Field Firing Ranges in Rajasthan.

VSHORADS is a Man Portable Air Defence System designed and developed indigenously by Research Centre Imarat (RCI) in collaboration with other DRDO laboratories and Development cum Production Partners.

### PM Narendra Modi Inaugurates Banjara Virasat Museum in Maharashtra

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Banjara Virasat Museum in Pohardevi at Washim in Maharashtra, celebrating the rich heritage of the Banjara community.

The four-storey museum has 13 galleries depicting the Banjara legacy through the

portraits of Banjara community leaders and the Banjara movement.

### <u>Haryana Records 65.65 Percent Voter</u> Turnout

The single-phase polling for 90 Assembly constituencies in Haryana concluded peacefully across more than 20,000 polling stations, recording a final voter turnout of 65.65 percent, surpassing the 64.8 percent turnout recorded during the Lok Sabha elections in 2024.

A total of 1,031 candidates contested from the 90 assembly constituencies and 20,632 polling booths were set up for voting.

## Medium Transport Aircraft to Replace AN-32 and IL-76 fleets of IAF

The Medium Transport Aircraft, procured by the Indian Air Force (IAF), is going to be a common replacement for the ageing AN-32 and IL-76 transport aircraft fleet.

The AN-32 is the workhorse of the IAF, with over 100 aircraft in service, and the IL-76, with over a 40-tonne load capacity, is in the heavy lift category.

### **Mumbai Wins Irani Cup After 27 Years**

Mumbai won the Irani Cup after the five-day tie against Rest of India ended in a draw at the Atal Bihari Vajpayee Ekana Cricket Stadium. Mumbai emerged as the winner on the basis of the first-innings lead.

Mumbai's last Irani Cup victory came in 1997-98. Rest of India have the most, i.e. 30, Irani Cup wins.

### Francesco Bagnaia Wins Japanese Grand Prix

Ducati Lenovo team's Pecco Bagnaia won the Japanese Grand Prix.

Spaniard Acosta crashed with four laps to go while leading the field, allowing Bagnaia to take first ahead of Enea Bastianini and Marc Marquez.
